

## MISSION MATTERS

If you attended the Parish AGM, you will be aware that each member of the Mission Team had resigned. Although still passionate about mission, because of some personal health issues during 2020, Ray and I felt we could no longer effectively carry on. Since that decision, Ray's health has improved, we have meet with Chris and agreed to stay on until the end of the year, and mentor the new people who have shown an interest. This way there will be an orderly hand over. We are delighted that Terry Craze, Lyn Haines, Anneke Hoogervorst, and Shavi Ratnayake have decided to join us. We hope to also welcome Glenda Hicks at the next meeting.

I would like to thank all who donated to the Anglican Mission Lenten Appeal. \$1,728.50 was given, with approximately equal splits between the three projects. Thank you for your generosity. Your donation is being sent to them as I write this (!!), which will add to the \$31,872 AM has already received for the Lenten Appeal. A Power Point presentation this Sunday will give you a glimpse of what AM have been able to achieve with the donations they receive.

One of the trends I have noticed over the years, is the cooperative way likeminded mission organisations are working together. For instance, Anglican Missions is currently advertising the Christian World Service Appeal for Covid Relief in India. AM do not have trusted Partners in that country, while Christian World Service has for many years worked with five partner organisations in Tamil Nadu on the long term development, and justice priorities of the Dalit (sometimes called the Untouchables) and tribal communities. During the first wave of the pandemic these people were helped by the member organisations. Unfortunately, now, as the disaster deepens in India, more help is needed to ensure these vulnerable people are supplied with the necessities to maximise their chance of survival: food, hygiene supplies, PPE, access to vaccinations etc. Donations to the Coronavirus Emergency Appeal can be made: Online at: <https://cws.org.nz/donate-now-coronavirusappeal/> or by Post to: CWS, PO Box 22652, Christchurch 8140.

You may remember that last year NZCMS, the Christchurch Diocese and Anglican Missions raised funds to keep the Mirpurkhas Boys' Hostel, Hyderabad open until secure funding could be arranged. An update about the funding follows: *By God's grace the money raised from NZ is stretching to see us through this ongoing academic year (2020-21), which is still continuing... with educational institutions again shut - the hostel is currently also closed for 3 weeks (then reviewed according to situation/ govt decision). Exams are currently planned from 15 June, let's see. The Diocese has not made significant progress with future fund raising (and is in fact struggling itself with these latest lockdowns and its impact). Along with another promised grant we should have*

*money for all of 2021. Beyond that we do not know at this stage, however I think there is a possible 50% grant coming which will help.*

I am delighted to be able to give you an update about Liz, Nick and Tessa - just bullet points, but please approach me if you want more in-depth information:

### **Liz**

- ⇒ Her re-entry visa had not been processed in time for her April 8<sup>th</sup> flight, and as of April 28<sup>th</sup> she still had not received it. She has a tentative flight booked for July.
- ⇒ In her words: *"Life here is always unpredictable, so I am thankful for this routine of adjusting plans, and last minute changes- but it still takes emotion and energy."*
- ⇒ Exploring rescheduling SYIS (Sharpen Your Interpersonal Skills) workshops.
- ⇒ In mid-May hoping to attend a consultation in Lahore on trauma counselling and response.
- ⇒ Marking papers and completing transcripts.
- ⇒ Hoping to travel to Murree to work in the cool.

### **Tessa**

- ⇒ Continuing to work with the Gulu Catholic Diocese to resolve old conflicts between two people groups, so they may more effectively protect their ancestral land from being taken from them. A Peace Committee has been formed.

### **Nick**

- ⇒ Working as a Doctor 2 mornings a week at the St Phillip's Clinic, managing 10 rural health clinics for the Anglican Diocese of Gulu and has set up 23 OneDay Health Centres in remote locations.
- ⇒ In 2021, he hopes to establish 20 more One Day Health Centres by partnering with 2 more Dioceses, though concedes that may be too ambitious if returning to Aotearoa in October.
- ⇒ In his words: *"I am often a little tired though, a combination of sporadic sickness, and often having to travel long distances on public transport to manage the OneDay Health Centres."*  
I suspect he is understating the *little* tired!

## Worship and Healing Meeting


