MISSION MATTERS - OCTOBER UPDATE

Nick and Tessa's visit – As I write this Nick and Tessa are settling into their two weeks isolation in MIQ. We will welcome them “out” with a celebration week of visits commencing with them preaching at all services on **Sunday 24th October**.

Nick said he will not necessarily be sharing about his work within the sermon but will share about this within small gatherings of people. They are really keen to connect with us although the expectation of Tessa being present will be limited as she is still studying fulltime.

Daytime meeting on **Tuesday 26th October at 1.45pm**. combining with AAW in the St Tim's hall. All Welcome

Evening pot luck meal on **Wednesday 27th October at 6.00pm** in the St Tim's hall . This will be hosted by Joy and Rick Gaza's home group.

The last few months have been an exciting time for mission as we have allocated your hard earned funds to the following:

- ⇒ City Mission \$1000
- ⇒ Hagar \$500 for their work in walking with people rescued from trafficking, slavery and abuse - see their website: hagar.org.nz
- ⇒ Mirpurkhas Hostel in Pakistan – special appeal requested through Liz \$1570
- ⇒ Arocha NZ \$500 – for their work in creation care see their website arocha.org.nz
- ⇒ As well as our usual contributions to Nick, Tessa and Liz, 24/7, Anglican Mission and the hospital chaplains.
- ⇒ Before Christmas we will be contributing to the Persecuted church and the Bible Society.

Another exciting development is our intended link with Tear Fund NZ to sponsor a child so the young people in our parish can have a more meaningful connection through correspondence. Anneke will give more details on this in next month's Mission Matters.

This leads us into Christmas – and on behalf of the mission committee and the parish I would like to say a huge thank you to Philippa Rodley who coordinates the Operation Christmas shoe box appeal.



Christmas this year is especially important after two years of dealing with COVID. People here within the parish are exhausted let alone those in other countries, so thank you to those who have already supported this appeal.

Another way to support this appeal is to donate funds which will be used to cover the postage for these boxes which amounts to around \$500 each year or for Philippa to top up some boxes. Just label your donation as "Shoe box" appeal and we will know where to allocate the monies.

Anneke will also be highlighting another Christmas appeal next month when we intend to invite you to raise funds for purchasing a "Gift for life" through Tear Fund. These are gifts which enable the whole family within a community to e.g. start a small business, educate their child, etc. Again if you want to contribute to this appeal just label any donation as "Tear Fund" and I will co-ordinate the purchases. More on this next month though.

- Thank God that churches are now able to meet in person. We pray for those who are unable to attend, that they will remain spiritually strong and in good health.


Wednesday Congregation
