MISSION MATTERS

Greeting Parishioners

What pops into your mind when you see or hear the word 'Mission'? An important assignment? A vocation or calling to go out into the world and share one's faith. I suspect many of you would associate the word with evangelising. Maybe, though, using only words to share one's faith is not a wide enough definition. Yes, the apostles were sent into the world to share their faith, baptise, and teach. However, alongside of that they did a variety of other things. They practised healing; Paul and Barnabas were sent with famine relief (Acts 11:27-30) and Titus was sent to ensure ethical financial transactions took place (2 Cor.8:16-24). Those who were sent used both words and works to share and live out the "good news". Over the years, many have grappled with what should come under the Mission banner.

The world-wide Anglican Communion felt ring-fencing mission as just evangelising was too narrow, and sought to develop a more holistic definition of mission. In 1984, the Anglican Consultative Council developed what was known as the Four Marks of Mission. In 2012, ACC added wording to the Fourth Mark, to include the need for Christians to challenge violence and work for peace, and, in 1990, a Fifth Mark was added that focussed on caring for creation. These Five Marks have won wide acceptance among Anglicans and other Christian traditions and offer a practical guide to the holistic nature of mission. As you can see, they are dynamic, occasionally being tweaked to better reflect our contemporary understanding.

The Five Marks are:

- To proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom.
- To teach, baptise and nurture new believers.
- To respond to human need by loving service.
- To seek to transform unjust structures of society, to challenge violence of every kind and pursue peace and reconciliation.
- To strive to maintain the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of the Earth.



Some churches abbreviate the Five Marks to five words: TELL-TEACH-TEND-TRANSFORM-TREASURE.

During August, as part of Mission Month, each Sunday we will focus on one of those Marks, by publishing a small insert in the news sheet, having a sermon/talk based on the theme and showing a 2 minute video that Anglican Missions are producing. Some Sundays there will be an update featuring a particular Mission Partner.

Please note the themes may not be in order, to accommodate speakers' availability.

Through a Lenten Appeal, our Parish helped raise funds for RSNF, to enable them to buy a van to transport children, who were having cleft lip surgery, to the hospital in Kampala. That vehicle has made the logistics of that journey smoother, more user friendly and cheaper.

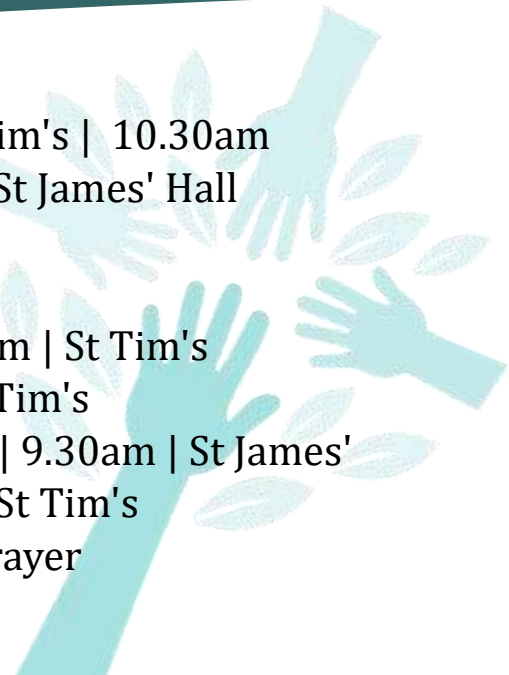

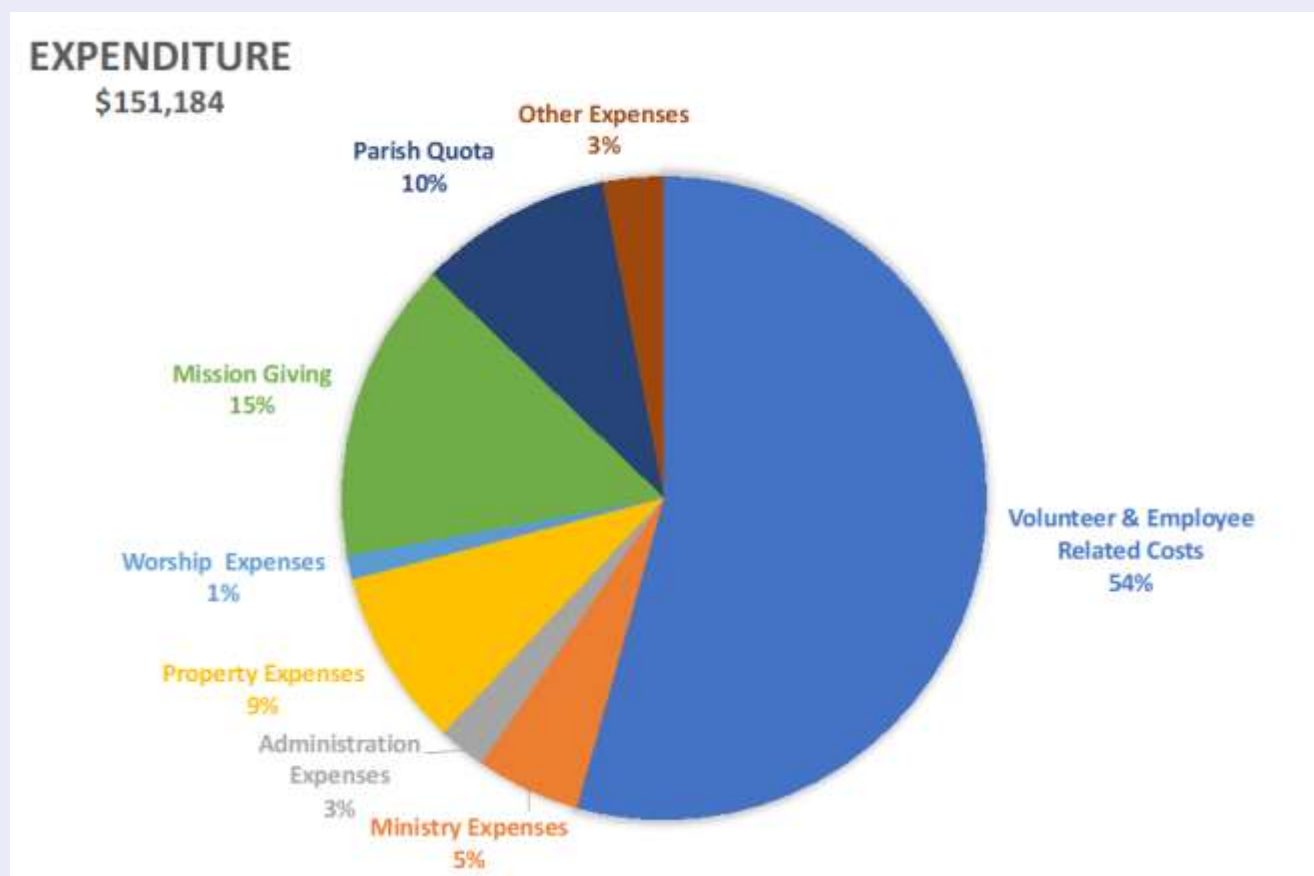

1st January – 30th June 2023 (6 months)

The aim of the parish is *Making lifelong disciples of Jesus*.

One of the fuels that is essential for us to be able to fulfill this aim is our finances. With the first 6 months of 2023 behind us, it is now an appropriate time to provide an update on the parish finances for the first 6 months of 2023. The above finance figures are for the parish and therefore are inclusive of both St Timothy's and St James'.

The global figures for both income and expenditure are close to that budgeted. We have spent \$20,562 above the income received. However, this deficit was forecasted and was covered by savings as planned.

The money you generously give – however much or little - is so important and so appreciated. As often mentioned, giving of finances is simply part of our worship to Jesus.

Please do feel free to ask for additional information or ask questions regarding this update. Transparency is central to the stewardship of the parish finances.

Finally, I want to acknowledge the work of Noela Rendle as Parish Treasurer, the wider Finance Committee, Vestry members, and indeed many others that help to ensure the very best stewardship of our parish finances.
