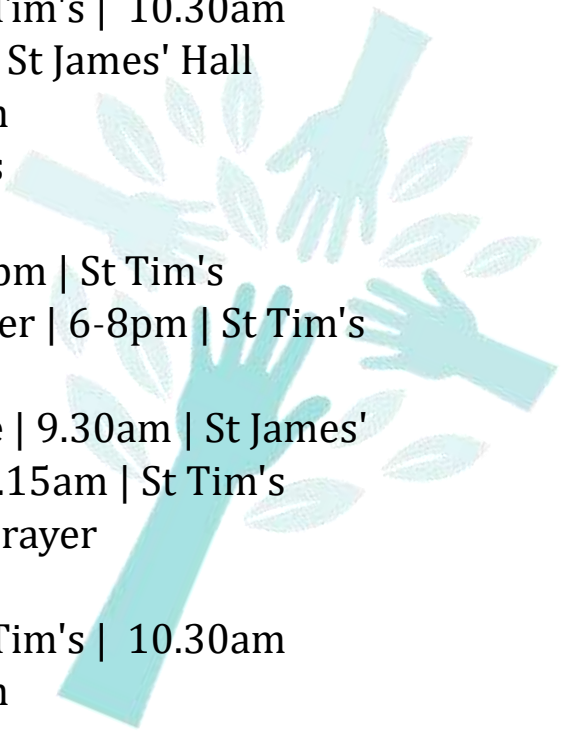

THE FOURTH MARK OF MISSION - TRANSFORM

This Sunday our focus is on the Fourth Mark of Mission - To seek to transform unjust structures of society, to challenge violence of every kind, and to pursue peace and reconciliation. This mark is an example of the dynamic nature of the Five Marks of Mission, which are regularly reviewed. At its 2012 meeting in Auckland, New Zealand, the Anglican Consultative Council (ACC) revised the wording of the Fourth Mark of Mission, adding the phrase “to challenge violence of every kind and pursue peace and reconciliation” to the pre-existing text “to seek to transform the unjust structures of society”.

As Christians we believe all people are unique and loved by God. We are also exhorted to love our neighbours. In this modern connected world, who is not our neighbour? Additionally, both the Old and New Testaments indicate God’s people are to walk in His ways and practise righteousness and justice. That can be hard, as often the issues involved are complicated, occur within challenging contexts and threaten the powerful.

This is what our Mission Partner, Tessa, has found. Prior to completing her PhD on land issues in Northern Uganda, she was working with two people groups in that area, who were not only in conflict with each other over land, but also with the government who was trying to gazette their land. Those issues have not yet been resolved.

However, Saferworld and USAID, have had some success, using a consensus - based approach, with the many land conflicts in that context. From 1986-2006, people were displaced from their land during a time of conflict between the Ugandan Government and the Lord's Resistance Army, a particularly sadistic group. This displacement weakened the existing customary land ownership and deteriorated informal land boundaries; vulnerable widows become embroiled with relatives, particularly if there was no will to validate their claims.

One effective way to resolve the land disputes has been to set up, teams composed of respected local leaders, trained in mediation skills. One religious leader involved, used Bible verses to explain issues – it is against religious teachings to extend boundaries beyond your own. Sometimes the process is long, as good will and trust need to be established, but in 4 years 420 out of 450 cases were resolved using the USAID mediation approach. What an outcome!
